POST-CONFERENCE REPORT

INTRODUCTION

PASMAE 2013 took place in Kampala, Uganda from 29th July 2013 to 1st August 2013. It was held at the Silver springs Hotel, Bugolobi, a suburb of Kampala! The theme for this year's conference was *Inter-cultural Approaches to Musical Arts Education in Contemporary Africa*. The main aim of this research and practice conference was to provide, and promote, an interdisciplinary forum for the investigation of inter-cultural issues that impact on the delivery and dispensation of musical arts education across the continent of Africa. This successful 8th Pan African Society for Musical Arts Education conference received 126 attendees (106 paid participants and 20 volunteers) both international and local participants spanning the academia, public and private sectors. This was a considerable increase in attendance records of the previous PASMAE Conferences especially those of Lagos in 2009 and Gaborone in 2011. Participants were drawn from 9 countries representing three continents including Uganda (Host Country), Kenya, Nigeria, Mauritius, South Africa, United States, Ghana, Zambia, and Botswana. This PASMAE conference will had a tighter focus on advancing the insights developed over the past years, crystallize understandings, and identifying the key challenges as well as opportunities for collaboration ahead.

REGISTRATION

The first day started with registration for the participants. A team of three ladies led by Jolly Kushemererwa at the registration and information desk, received delegates arriving from international destinations and from within. At the desk participants had to register before picking up their conference bags containing materials including the conference magazine, program, abstracts, menu for the week, and name tags.

WELCOME RECEPTION AND OPENING CEREMONY

Cocktail Reception

The Cocktail Reception was held on in the evening by the swimming pool in the Hotel Gardens starting at 1900Hrs – 2000Hrs. The Guest of honour who was received by the College Principle Prof. Edward E. Kirumira, representing the Vice Chancellor of Makerere University, was the representative from the Ministry, the State Minister for Higher Education Hon. Muyingo. The Welcome Reception was well attended by Department Chairs, including Associate Professor Patrick Mangeni of the Department of Performing Arts and Film, lecturers from various universities around Kampala, our conference sponsors (including Centenary Bank, Quality Chemicals, Serena Hotel, Beverly tours and Travel, Livercot Impex, Daily Monitor, J & K Homes) the media fraternity, and students.

The Opening Ceremony

Right after the welcome reception, delegates converged into the Mutungo Ballroom for the Official Opening of the Conference. The Opening Ceremony was chaired by Dr. John Wayman, with help from Dr. Benon Kigozi, Conference Chair and Convener who delivered a Welcome Speech that included acknowledgements of all participants, volunteers, sponsors and performers. Other contributions included speeches from Associate Professor Patrick Mangeni of the Department of Performing Arts and Film, Prof. Edward E. Kirumira the Principle of the College of Humanities and Social Sciences, and that of the Minister of Education and Sports represented by Hon. Muyingo who performed the duty of officially opening the conference. Speeches were followed by a Keynote Address by Dr. Jesse McCarroll.

Research Paper Presentations

Research paper presentations were held in three parallel sessions classified per topics. They were presented by a large number of professionals from more than 18 Universities.

The main themes of the conference were:

- ownership of musical arts in contemporary Africa
- coping with the changing tastes: prescribed curriculums versus pupils' own music
- cross cultural influences on musical arts dispensation as expressed in teaching, performing, research, and demonstration.

Each paper presentation was allocated 20 minutes and the remaining 10 minutes were reserved for questions and discussions.

Kampala the capital of Uganda is an amazing tour destination located in the central region. Her main tourist attractions are majorly pre-colonial and colonial cites that have a lot historical attachment to Ugandans. Delegates who signed up were able to visit the city and the historical sites that include; the Kabaka's (King's) of Buganda Palace, the Kasubi Tombs (Buganda King's burial sites), Kabaka's lake (a man-made lake by the King of Buganda), Gothic Protestant and Catholic Cathedrals, Namugongo Martyrs Shrine, the Bahai Temple, the Gadafi Mosque (Uganda Supreme Muslim Council), Parliament of Uganda plus the Central Business District (CBD). Some delegates went as far as the Source of the River Nile towards the Eastern part of the country and the Equator in the Southern part of Uganda!
